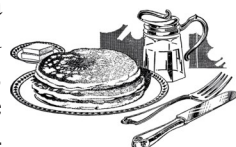

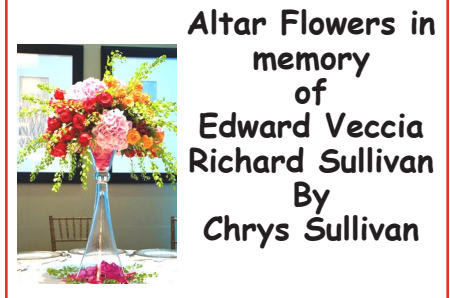
SISTERHOOD
